A Meeting was held this evening in the Schoolroom at 7.30 p.m.

III. After the letter was read (re - Sanitary Arrangements.) and after long discussion, it was proposed by the Rev<sup>d</sup> H. J. Davidson and seconded by Mr. Green "that the Clerk be instructed to write <sup>a letter</sup> to Mr. Butcher - Clerk to the Walsingham Rural District - embodying the suggestions of the Parish Council. This letter to be submitted to Col<sup>l</sup> Groom for approval or revision."

The following is a copy of the letter forwarded to Mr. Butcher.



Stippes Parish Council.  
January 25th. 1912.

The Clerk to the  
Walsingham Rural District Council.  
Dear Sir,

I am instructed by the Stippes Parish Council to write to you stating that the Parish Council feel very strongly that the Scavenging Rate is extremely high, and suggest that the rate be reduced rather than increased. This suggestion is supported by the fact that a Memorial to the Parish Council, stating that the occupiers of houses in Stippes will empty and cleanse, and keep in a state of cleanliness, their own pails and dustbins, has been signed by fifty-one (51) occupiers - a male occupier being prepared to do this in each case. The Parish Council has also to suggest that it should appoint its own officer (who should be responsible to the Sanitary Authority.) to inspect, systematically, the pails & dustbins of those occupiers who undertake the above duties. The above officer to be also empowered to attend to the emptying & cleansing of the pails &c of those occupiers who have no facilities of emptying their own.

Tuesday April 15th. 1913.

The Annual Meeting was held this evening in the Schoolroom at 7 o'clock

Agenda.

1. Signing of the Declaration
2. Election of Chairman.
3. Election of Vice-Chairman.
4. Minutes of the last Meeting.
5. Appointment of members to the School Management Committee.
6. Signing of Accounts for the year ending March 31st. 1913.

There were present: - Colonel Gray, Messrs Ringwood, Green, Wordingham, Reynolds

Before the meeting commenced each of the above signed the Statutory Declaration.

The Clerk occupied the chair until the election of the Chairman of the Parish Council was dealt with.

- I. Mr. Reynolds proposed 'that Mr. W. H. Craps be Chairman of the Parish Council for the ensuing year.' Mr. Green seconded this proposition which was unanimously carried. Mr. Craps had previously made known to the members of the Council his intention of accepting an invitation from

them to act as Chairman of the Parish Council

- II. Mr. Wordingham proposed 'that Mr. Ringwood be Chairman of the present meeting in the absence of Mr. Craps' This was seconded by Mr. Reynolds, and was carried unanimously.

- III. 'That the Rev. A. F. Davidson be Vice-Chairman of the Parish Council' was proposed by Mr. Wordingham, and seconded by Mr. Reynolds.  
Carried unanimously.

- IV. The Minutes of the last meeting were read by the Clerk, and signed by the Chairman of the meeting after the Clerk had informed the members present that Clarence Bayfield was tenant of No. 4 Allotment.

Unanimous agreement.

- V. The Clerk next read the circular letter from the Norfolk Education Committee respecting the appointment of a school manager.

Mr. Reynolds proposed 'that Mr. Wordingham represent the Parish Council on the Stippox School Management Committee' This was seconded by Mr. Green, and was agreed to by all members present.

- VI. It was decided to leave the signing of the yearly accounts until the return of the



Chairman of the Parish Council who was away from home.

The appointment of Overseers had been omitted from the Agenda, and as Mr. Ringwood was again proposed one of the Overseers he vacated the chair in favour of Colonel Grey with the consent of all councillors present.

Mr. Reynolds proposed "That Mr. Ringwood and Mr. Wordingham be re-appointed Overseers of the Parish of Stiffey." Mr. R. Green seconded.

Carried unanimously.

The appointment was duly signed.

This terminated the Meeting.

The Rev. A. J. Davidson signed the Declaration before the Council left the room.

I. The Clerk read the Minutes of the last Meeting which were unanimously agreed to and were duly signed by the Chairman.

II. A Precept for £2 was agreed upon & signed by the Chairman, Col. Groom & Col. Gray.

III. During the discussion on the "Overseers of the Parish" Col. Groom suggested that it might still be possible for that two gentlemen might be obtained to act as Overseers for the ensuing year, and further suggested that Mr. Craper & Mr. Wordingham might perform the duties. After some little talk it was agreed that a Memorandum to the following effect be placed in the Minute Book.



"That Mr. Craper & Mr. Wordingham act as Overseers for the Parish of Stiffkey during the ensuing year 1914-1915, Mr. Wordingham to collect the rates and Mr. Craper to do the clerical work which forms a part of the duties of Overseers - always providing that no gentleman, or gentleman offer(s) himself, or themselves, to perform the duties of Overseers for the Parish between the present meeting and the next."

4. After the current year's Expenses had been read by the Chairman a Cheque for £2. 13. 10. was duly signed.

5. The Allotments' Rents have been paid by the tenants & the proper amount has been sent to Mr. J. C. Blofeld by the Clerk.
