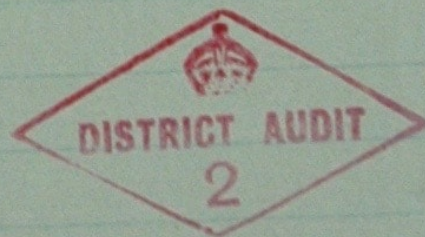

The Chairman informed the deputation that the matter would be dealt with by the Council, & the deputation left immediately.

R. & Draper) explaining the matter to him, & to state that the Council were of the opinion that a reduction in the rent of ~~8~~ eight shillings per acre, per annum, (being the amount of the increase of rent in 1922) would be very acceptable to the holders of the Council's allotments.

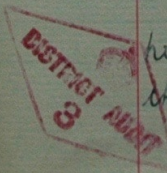
